

### Panda

Pandas are very tall creatures that live in the central forests of China. Pandas have a unique physical appearance, interesting survival skills, and eating habits. Pandas are truly unique animals. Pandas have a lot of black and white fur that is striped. Their faces, however, are mostly white, except the eyes and ears. A panda can weigh 300-400 pounds! A male is



approximately 6-8 feet tall, while a female is only 5 feet tall. Although a panda's DNA is the same as a bear's, it does have features that a bear has. For example, pandas have opposable thumbs and huge jaw muscles that can chew through weak metals, while bears do not. A newborn panda is pink and it is the size of a newborn kitten. It has no teeth and its eyes are closed. It has almost invisible white fur. Indeed, pandas look different from other animals.

Pandas live in the central forests of China. They need at least two types of bamboo, otherwise they will starve. They also need high places to climb. In addition, pandas use lots of leaves to hide from predators. They usually live on mountain slopes. They need other pandas when they look for mates. They need lots of light, too. They like leafy bushes and wet grass even though they are not necessary for their survival. As you can see, pandas have a complex habitat.

Pandas have many enemies in the rigorous landscapes of China.



They also have to eat lots of bamboo each day. How are they going to survive? Fortunately, they have strategies to make it easier for them to survive. For instance, pandas only digest one fifth of what they eat, which is the reason they spend 12-16 hours a day eating bamboo.

However, they do not just eat bamboo. Sometimes when bamboo is not visible, they eat small animals and plants. Pandas do not only have to worry about eating food, but they also have to worry about hungry predators. However, they have survival skills that they use to defend themselves. For instance, pandas



can climb to an altitude of 13,000 feet and are also great swimmers. Their skin also blends in with trees and they can hide behind bushes. The scientific name of a panda is Ailuropoda Melandera. Pandas also belong in the family Ursidae. The Ursidae family is the bear family. Unfortunately, the panda population is decreasing. In the 1970s, there were only about 1,500 pandas left. It was mostly the decrease in bamboo that caused their population to go down. China has been implementing measures to try to protect pandas. In conclusion, pandas are exceptional animals that will need our help to survive.

# 一颗镶嵌在大洋彼岸的小明珠 一一多丽都中文学校侧记

Toledo坐落于美国俄亥俄州北部地区,和密西根州毗邻,与加拿大接壤。


这是一座漂亮的北部城市,内敛含蓄,优雅沉稳,莫米河旖旎多姿地穿越城区,给这座北方小城带去了灵动和秀丽,似乎蕴藏着无限生机。

在这座不大的北方城市里,有一群积极团结的华人,她们来自中国大陆、台湾以及香港地区,她们传承了中华民族勤奋拼搏的传统美德,在异国他乡踏实勤恳的努力生活,安家落户。和美国大多数三四线城市一样,这里的华人社团由华人教会、华人协会以及华语学校共同组成,"多丽都中文学校"便是Toledo华人社团中的一员,由热心教育事业的台湾华人朋友于七十年代初在当地创办,经过几次主办方的交接以及教学场所的更换,于2007年迁入现位于MVCDS的校址,这是一所由华人民间力量自主办学的教育机构。每周六,这里聚集着托莱多地区华人家庭的孩子以及热衷于学习汉语和中华文化的少数非华裔美国籍本土学生。两个小时的汉语课和一个小时的兴趣班(国际象棋,中华武术,绘画,朗诵&主持,英文写作,中国书法)给当地华人孩子创造了学习汉语以及了解中华传统文化的平台,在现任校长杜玲玲的带领下,每年学习汉语的学生数量呈递增趋势。

"多丽都中文学校"目前设有从学前班K到7年级共8个年级的中文班级,《美洲华语》是目前中文学校使用的教材,这是一套由教育学者及专家为在美国的华人孩子在周末学习汉语时量身打造的教材,内容生动有趣,浅显易懂。

学生每个学年按照任课老师制定的学习进度学习一册教材,通过课堂讲解、家庭作业、课堂测验以及期中、期末考试等等,帮助学生学习汉语,巩固中文知识。每学期期末,学生们都将参加期末考试,成绩合格者第二学年可以升级,不合格的学生将留级一年继续学习。

为了更广泛的传播中华文化, "多丽都中文学校"专门为汉语不是母语的学生在CFL级开设了两个班,采用同样的教材,相对较慢的教学速度,结合学生们的实际情况开展教学,提供优质的切合实际的服务。同时, "





在Cafeteria,还有一个比较有特色的项目就是由热衷于茶文化的家长朋 友自发设立的Tea corner, Tea corner 为家长们提供了"以茶会友, 品茶论 生活"的一个平台。精美的茶具、品种繁多的香茗以及茶桌的布置使家长 朋友们活动之余可以围坐在一起品茶畅谈,结识朋友,交流信息,增进友 情。孩子们课余时间也会围过来讨一杯茶喝,耳濡目染般地了解了一些中 国的茶文化、茶知识以及茶桌的布置与氛围。除了每周校方给家长们提供 的服务之外,中文学校最有特色的活动项目就是在学校Cafeteria举办一年 一度的万圣节和元宵节小吃义卖。"小吃义卖"由校方组织,热心家长和 当地支持中文学校的餐馆共同参与,家长们捐赠自制的各种精美食物、甜 点、传统风味小吃,餐馆也捐赠出各自的招牌菜。由于小吃义卖都是当地 华人朋友自制的美食, 所以可以品尝到中国各地的传统美食。小吃义卖不 仅吸引着家长们踊跃参与, 也吸引了当地的华人朋友和留学生前来捧场品 尝,这样有意义的活动不仅是一场饕餮盛宴,更是一项校方与家长以及当 地华人的交流活动, 使更多的华人家庭参与进来, 在支持当地中文教育的 同时,分享美食,增进感情,彼此回馈。小吃义卖的所售款项用于中文学 校的日常教师培训以及课堂教具的购买,这是一项非常有意义的活动,中 文学校也会将这项活动传承下去、在未来使其更加完善、更加精彩。 Toledo这座城市规模不大,华人不多,但正是因为华人少,所以这里的华 人社团让你感受到更多的是团结互助,积极温暖。"多丽都中文学校"不 仅是当地华人孩子学习汉语,接受中华传统文化教育的场所,同时也是一 个面向家长以及当地华人朋友交流信息、结识朋友、增进友情的平台。校 方一贯的教学宗旨是:在做好当地华人孩子的汉语教学以及传播中华传统 文化的同时协助中华协会共同打造一个良好有序的文化生态圈, 让华人孩 子受益的同时也让家长朋友们感受到温暖与和谐。

# 每个人都可以学中文

我是陈紫欣,是托莱多中文学校 2018年的毕业生,现在十五岁。我写这 篇短文的原因是想分享给大家我在中文 学校的经验,并分享一些让我能够在 AP 中文考试达到满分的学习技巧。

第一,我想说我非常幸运能够认识到中文学校的每位校长,老师,人员。他们介绍给我他们学校的AP中文班,给了我这么好的一个机会,也让我发现自己的一个潜力。AP是一个万不能错过的机会;你能用它来争取大学学分,节省学费和时间。于是,我开始更加努力的学习中文。

在我开始上中文学校和我自习之间,我还见识了另一种方式学中文:这就是我和一个小组跟一位非常耐心又聪明的导师上课。我在那段时间提高了我的写作和词汇知识。我发现这是一个很不错的学习方式因为有位老师在更正我,让我更快的学到更好的中文,所以我认为有个老师的教导也是非常重要的,尤其是对于那些可能无法自学的人。因此,我认为中文学校是一个极好的场地给任何想要学中文的人因为它开设着多数级别的中文课,而且每一位老师都很有知识,也十分认真的为学生安排。我个人在中文学校上的AP Prep 班虽然每周只有一小时,我还是学到了很多。那个班的 Ivy 老师很用心的教我读、写、说、听汉语,让我各方面的中文都提升了。虽然在这班内我需要比之前更加用功,上完这个课程给了我很大的成就感,特别是我考完考试收到了结果之后。

我以前认识不到中文对我的好处,现在觉得懂中文真好;它不只是一个语言,你还能用它来更加了解中国奇妙又悠长的文化历史,也让自己以后在这竞争的社会里更加得力。学习中文也让我将来想去中国学习工作的梦想更实际。学中文不必要成为一个烦闷,你可以把它加并到你的喜好里:如果你喜欢唱歌,可以试着唱中文歌曲,若你爱看电视,可以看一些华人电视节目。这些都是能提高中文能力的小技巧。我非常感谢你花时间读我这篇短文。如果你是个学生,我希望你能从中得到一点启发。家长,我希望你继续鼓励你们的孩子,支持他们做聪慧的选择,不管有没有学中文。
