CAGT will be a major sponsor of the 5th Annual Great Maumee River Dragon Boat Festival. The festival, a fund raising event for Toledo Partners In Education, will be held at International Park, Toledo on July 29, 2006. A major shortcoming of the Festival in previous years was the lack of Chinese culture activities. CAGT's participation this year will help present an exciting, educational, and fun Chinese atmosphere, and at the same time promoting Chinese cultures.

On Feburary 19th, several CAGT members, Luaane Billstein, Joe Chao, Guangzhong Chen, Jiquan Chen, Jing Deng Meyer and Hewen Slak, met with Marilyn Levine (Director of the Dragon Boat Festival) to discuss the sponsorship details. In addition to participating in the dragon boat races, CAGT will also provide Chinese food vendors, traditional music, dance, arts and crafts, displays and other methods to promote the Chinese American community in Toledo. Fourteen non-Chinese adults gather around a dining room table on a Sunday afternoon, slowly struggling with their lessons. "Wo Shi Xuesheng.", one tries. The others concentrate on the pronunciation for soon it will be their turn to practice saying a few words of greeting that they are learning in the new language class for adults. The class is one of the ways that CAGT is reaching out to Toledoans who want to gain a basic knowledge of conversational Mandarin.

Many of the students in the class are parents of children who were adopted in China. Bob and Luanne Billstein have four children including two sons born to them and two daughters adopted in China. "One -third of our family is Chinese American," says Luanne, "and in order for us to fully embrace our culture, we wanted to learn how to speak the language. At least a little....".

The Mandarin class meets once a week for one hour. The curriculum has been designed and is implemented by three

instructors who are CAGT members: Joyce Jiang, Litza Lee, and Lynne Ye. The class will meet until the end of the school year in June.

"We are so grateful for the patience of our instructors. Most of us students have horrible pronunciation, but we are really trying. Some in our class are preparing to travel to China to bring their child home, and they will now be able to converse at a very basic level. My daughters are now 7 and 8 years old, and we would like them to learn the language too," says Luanne. (Luanne Billstein)





Honors and Congratulations

• UT Outstanding Faculty Research Awarded to Dr. Jiquan Chen



Dr. Chen joined the UT faculty in 2001 and received the Sigma Xi/Dion D. Raftopoulos Award for Outstanding Research in 2004 for his work on landscape ecology and ecosystem science. "Dr. Chen is emerging as an international leader in ecology," wrote a nominator. "He is doing some exciting research on global climate changes that has gained positive attention for the department and the University in the local media and, more importantly, raised the profile of the University and our programs both nationally and internationally among peer scientists."

While at UT, Chen has published 64 articles and three books. "Dr. Chen's publications have been consistently influential in his field. All together, his papers have been cited over 1,000 times," a nominator wrote. Since 2001, he has received some \$3 million in grants from the National Science Foundation, the U.S. Department of Agriculture Forest Service, and the state of Missouri, the Department of Energy, the Joint Fire Science Program and others. Recent work includes creating a mobile cart to compete for funding from the National Ecological Observatory Network (NEON).

PS. CAGT members, Dr. Ben Koo and Dr. Xiong Ming Deng also won this award in the past from UT.

• UT China Trade Mission

Since last September, Dr. Dan Johnson the president of the University of Toledo came back from China, his first trip to the country, he has passionately inspired people to visit this emerging super power of the next century with a great recommendation, a must read book "The World is Flat" by Thomas Friedman.

In April this year, UT organized a team "Toledo Economics Development Trade Mission" to China again in an attempt to recruit students and business, leading by Dr. Johnson and the Port Authority President Mr. Jim Hartung, for two weeks visit. The delegation consisted of 17 people, including Owens Community College President Adams, two UT trustees, and three deans of UT/MUO.

In the two weeks the delegation visited Qinhuangdao, Beijing, and Shanghai. "This has been the most exhausting, but perhaps the most enlightening, two weeks of my life. The Chinese people are welcoming and gracious." Owens Community College President Dr. Christa Adams said.


• TSCI invite QHD visit in the end of July


The Fall Music Festival at Its Climax

Following the 20th Anniversary of the Sister Cities Relationship between Qinhuangdao and Toledo in 2005, and the University of Toledo - Toledo-Lucas County Port Authority Trade Mission to Qinhuangdao, Beijing and Shanghai, ever-growing waves of interest and opportunity are carrying Toledo closer and closer to China. The Year 2006 brought a strong partnership between the Chinese Association of Greater Toledo and Toledo Sister Cities International, Serving Northwestern Ohio (www.tsci.org). Both organizations prepared programs to host a Delegation from the Chinese Consulate of New York City for the Dragon Boat Festival, two business delegations from Shenyang and Beijing, and a secondary school and public health delegation from Qinhuangdao.

Through the growing commitment to opening Toledo to expanded cooperation, trade and investment with China, a concept of developing a China Cultural and Trade Center for Toledo is now being discussed – thanks to the Chinese Association of Greater Toledo. To address this possibility, a China Development and Investment Task Force is being formed, bringing together the efforts of local government, Port Authority, Regional Growth Partnership, UT, TSCI, CAGT, as well as several private developers.

Beyond the Task Force, possibilities being explored between TSCI and CAGT include: expanding the opportunity to study Mandarin Chinese in our local schools, expanding the presence of Chinese-owned business and institutions in Toledo, assisting the CAGT Chinese Youth Orchestra's plans to travel to Qinhuangdao, as well as possible trade and tourism missions to China in 2007. China Office Open under UT's OGI Program

On July 1, 2006, the University of Toledo began a new era of international education and economic development. Established on that date by the UT Board of Trustees was the new Office of Global Initiatives (OGI) designed to provide stimulation and impetus for international outreach and the mandate to create a "China Office." The mission of the new OGI is to:

- Guide and direct the International Student Services office, the American Language Institute, study abroad, Kohler grants and the Fulbright program.
- Work in close cooperation with the Deans of the UT Colleges, Confucius Institute, and Asian Studies Program, to facilitate international education program/curriculum development; faculty and student exchange, and; collaborative research.
- Work in close cooperation with and provide assistance to the Directors of the Office of Economic Development, the International Business Institute, the Intermodal Transportation Institute, Great lakes Training program, and the Science and Technology Corridor to extend UT opportunities abroad.
- Work in close cooperation with the Toledo Sister Cities organization to link elements of the UT with the education mission of the Sister Cities International around the world.
- Initiate and direct the UT presence in China through its office to be called the Toledo Center Shanghai and Beijing.
- Work directly with the offices of the Provost and Vice President for Enrollment Management to establish
 international collaborative agreements designed to increase international student enrollment and increased
 opportunity for student study abroad.
- Work directly with the Associate Vice President for Alumni Relations to assist in the development of international alumni chapters.
- Work directly with the Vice Presidents of UT and MUO Foundations to assist in the identification of significant international alumni chapter members who can contribute to the Capital Campaign.
- Work in collaboration with local and regional agencies such as the Toledo Port Authority to establish economic development and research opportunities between the UT and counterparts in countries abroad.
- Work cooperatively with other institutions of higher education in the Toledo and NWO/SEM area to develop international educational outreach resulting in institutional diversity, increased enrollment, student/faculty exchange and collaborative research.

Our successes to date include the location of our two new offices in China and the proposed hiring of staff at those locations. Three trips to China have been completed – one in June; the second in October, and the third in November. A fourth will follow in early January. A second Toledo Economic Development Trade Mission co-sponsored by UT and the Toledo Port Authority is being proposed for Spring 2007.

Our recent signings of Exchange Agreements with Yanshan University in Qinhuangdao, Shanghai University of Finance and Economics, Beijing Technical University and Beijing Forestry University, Sichuan University in Chengdu and South China University of Technology in Guangzhou enable us to offer a broad range of experiences for students and faculty to study and do research in China. Other similar signings will take place in the near future in China at Shanghai Institute of Foreign Trade, Shanghai University and East China University of Science and Technology, all in Shanghai. Also an agreement with Aichi University in Japan as an exchange site will be signed in January 2007.




