运用中国资本, 带动托莱多城走进国际舞台

TCC 新闻特稿 罗惠文

在九月下旬,位于俄州西北角的托莱多城,将与中国深圳高交会合作举行五大湖区 经济高峰论谈。这是近年来在北美一件罕有的大事,届时将有逾百名中国投资商浩浩荡荡 前来参加,希望通过这个会议找到对口合作伙伴,并利用这个平台走进北美,开创海外事 业。

"托莱多有很大的潜力,而现在中国人有钱到海外投资。世界已经成为一个地球村的今天。我们托城即将展开的五大湖世界经济论坛就是一个很好的例子,在九月下旬,超过上百位中国投资商来到托城,参观考察。看看如何利用中美双方的资源,达到互利共赢。我们帮助中国人走进北美市场,同时带动托城的经济,是件美好的事。"罗惠文,托城中国事务交流中心的主席,很骄傲的说

在托莱多城,许多和惠文怀有同样的愿景的华人努力站出来,积极参与了这次盛会 筹划工作。

托城大名鼎鼎的欧文斯州立学院数学系陈光忠教授这二十年来,致力于中美教育,商务的交流,也是五大湖筹备组的主要干事之一,说道:"我这些年引来大大小小不计其数的中国代表团,但基本上都是看看就走。为什么呢?托莱多是个好地方,地利绝对有,但当年天时、人和还不具备。现在就不一样了:近十年来中美经济此消彼长,我们这次大会引来了众多的有钱的中国商人,这是天时;为了这次大会几十名当地美国人志愿在筹委会里辛勤工作,当地企业纷纷赞助,这是人和。所以我们可以说是生逢其时,愿大家共同为改变托莱多的面貌努力!"

托莱多大学亚洲研究所主任张欣教授说,"中国经济规模已经世界排名第二,民间有大量资本在寻找出路。托莱多的土地、工资便宜,交通方便,周边制造业供应链齐全,是国内企业寻求海外发展的理想目的地。这几年大量来访的中国学者和留学生,也成为介绍国内企业商界来托莱多的桥梁"。

俄亥俄州的托莱多城位于美国心脏地带,距世界汽车首都底特律只有一个钟头车程。全美国最长的两条公路,东到西的 I 80/90 及,从南边的佛罗里达直通密歇根的 I75,交汇与此。也就是说这个城是北美的十字路口。她也是俄州第四大城,五大湖第四大港。若以拖城为中心化个园,500 英里内覆盖了北美近 50%的产能。

这个城的地理位置不仅有特殊优势,而且科技进步。有美国太阳谷之称。而全世界第一辆吉普车也是在1941年于此出产。不仅汽车制造上游产业的工装磨具达两百多家,就是科技研发,医药,及生命科学也属顶尖. 这个不大不小的城,人文资源丰富,深厚。文艺复新的收藏全美博物馆前十大。动物园也是全美前十名。美国第一支熊猫就是在此展出。打从2008北美汽车产业衰退,托城经济也惨遭打压。房地产掉的不像话。但这也成为中国新财富的投资最好时机。最好地点。

"我要让托莱多成为一个国际城,"惠文指着她为中国报纸所做的报导,分享她在 托莱多城的经验及对该城的憧憬。

"我走过上百个国家,但托城的景色优美宁静,人民生活朴实,社区的多元文化,对少数民族的友善开放态度是许多地方不能比的"。"这个城是处于美国的心脏地带,代表了最纯正美国人的生活方式及品味。许多新的产品及餐馆都是在此试销,若反应不佳,也就没戏好唱。"

"为了筹备这次大会,全城出动,上从市政府,五大湖经济开发委员会,托莱多大学,港物局,及当地观光局,房产委员会,银行,保险公司,医院,广告公司,当地五百强的数大公司,不仅捐款,每周开会,还派了代表赶紧去孔子学院院学些简单中文,要好好接待这上百名中国商人。"三天的大会还有托城的交响乐团及艺术学院参与表演。"这是一个最典型美国人的草根运动,让人非常感动"。惠文说。

如今透过文宣,俄国,德国,丹麦及中国的中央电视台都将来采访。惠文也在加紧时间,带动几个才华横溢的学生们用最低的成本制造一个短的视频,放在 youtube 及国内 YouKu 上,详尽地介绍托城的商机优势。让全托城的人在世界任何角落,随时随地都可方便的介绍托莱多市,把她隆重推向国际舞台.



美国五大湖全球经济论坛,**上百名的中国投资商参加北美最大的中美招商盛会** *罗惠文*

在2012年9月24日-26日,美国俄亥俄州,托莱多城,将有上百多个中国投资商来到这里参与北美最大的中美招商盛会:五大湖全球经济论坛,中国深圳高交会(北美)海外分会。主办单位有托莱多市政府、美国大湖区经济发展协会(RGP)及五大湖国际集团。赞助单位:俄亥俄州政府,托莱多大学,托莱多港务局,托莱多商会。在后金融危机时代,中美两国商界之间的合作变得更加密切而广泛。近几年,中国政府加大了鼓励中国企业"走出去"的支持力度。同时,美国对中国资本有着极大的吸引力。中国企业在美投资环境空前良好。但是如何走出去?

"走出去"该走到哪?

美国中西部是美国制造业的核心地带,有70%的制造业集中在这片区域。中西部地区以优惠的政策、发达的交通运输系统、低廉的劳动力、完善的基础设施支持这里密集的制造业。托莱多市是美国中西部地区的心脏地带,处于北美几大制造业城市芝加哥,克里夫兰,底特律,哥伦布斯的交通正中心,毗邻底特律国际机场,陆运水运方便,是中国投资者最佳落脚点。

由于中美两国在文化、沟通、认知度方面的差异性,很多中国企业很难找到正确进入美国市场的契机。美国企业也面临同样的问题。因受到语言、搜索习惯的影响,一些国内优势项目及产业园区很难在互联网搜寻,造成了美国企业在投资初期时选址及项目上的失误。
