Chinese Community at the 2013 Toledo International Festival

On Saturday, April 13, Toledo Sister Cities International held its annual Toledo International Festival at the University of Toledo. The local Chinese community actively participated in this fun and culture rich event.

Toledo's Chinese sister city is
Qinghuangdao. The sister city relationship was primarily initiated

by Michael Cicak of Glasstech in cooperation with Mayor Donna Owens in 1985. Since then, many Chinese and American community leaders and colleagues have developed and supported various initiatives between Toledo and Qinhuangdao, including educational and cultural exchange, business and economic development, medical and health collaboration, and many other areas.

Within Toledo Sister Cities International, there is a China-Qinghuangdao committee. The committee had two tables at the event displaying pictures of Qinghuangdao, Chinese arts and crafts, as well as teaching people how to make Chinese good luck and friendship bracelets.

CAGT organized a variety of performances from the Chinese community to participate in the event. These performances received wonderful comments.

Cassandra has focused her dance study & performance on the Egyptian Raks Sharqi & folkloric dances since 1974. Her serious studies began in San Francisco with the legendary performer Jamilla Salimpour, and have continued since 1980 through regular research trips to the Middle East. Cassandra began her career as a cabaret performer, and her work in this area of Oriental Dance continued until 2010.

Since 1984, she has widened the scope of her artistic expression by presenting the dance on the theater stage. In 1989, Cassandra founded Jawaahir Dance Company, dedicated to bringing the rich heritage of the Middle East to the theater stage as a living art form. She is currently serving as Artistic Director and Choreographer for the Company. Cassandra is a past recipient of the Minnesota Dance Alliance/McKnight Foundation Resident Choreographer's Award, as well as the MDA/Jerome Foundation Sponsor Pool and Dancer Pool Awards. She taught Arabic women's dance classes as adjunct faculty through University College at the University of Minnesota for 15 years, and is a featured artist at the Southern Theater.

Cassandra teaches & performs world-wide, and has earned an international reputation as an Oriental dance teacher, researcher, and performer. She regularly offers workshops, concerts and master classes worldwide, in locations such as Cairo, Egypt, Marrakech, Morocco, as well as Finland, Great Britain, Germany, Australia, New Zealand, and throughout the US & Canada. World Tai Chi and Qigong Day

On April 27th, local Tai Chi groups and Tai Chi fans gathered at Wildwood Metropark to celebrate the 15th annual World Tai Chi and Qigong Day. This event is held in more than sixty countries on the last Saturday of April to promote the related disciplines of Tai Chi Chuan and Qigong. It begins in the earliest

time zone of New Zealand at 10 am, and then participants across Oceania, Asia, Africa, Europe, North America, and South America take part, ending with the final events in the last time zone of Hawaii, almost an entire day later.





Tai Chi Class – Summer 2013

There are many physical and mental benefits of practicing Tai Chi. One of the benefits of Tai Chi is the reduction of stress. Stress affects all of us in many different negative ways, stiffness, pain, worry, anxiety, etc. Through deep breathing and continuous slow movements, Tai Chi practice gives our mind and body complete rest and relaxation. One of the articles by the Mayo Clinic staff calls Tai Chi "A gentle way to fight stress".
