CAGT Civic Engagement Activities By Rui Shao

2016 was an exciting and stressful year for many, partly due to a heated general election that may have had a lasting impact on our society. Coming out to vote and letting our voices be heard is more important than ever. However, Chinese Americans have historically lower voter registration and turnout rates than rest of the population. On top of that, relatively few of us voice our concerns to elected officials. Such inaction often leads to our rights being ignored in the policy-making process.

This year, CAGT has taken up the challenge to change the status-quo. We organized or participated in events to educate our community, to reach out to state and local officials and to get more people out to vote. By doing so, our organization has reached a new milestone. Some of those events were made possible with the tremendous help from Asian Services In Action, Inc. (ASIA, Inc.), a 503(c) nonprofit serving Asian Americans and Pacific Islanders (AAPIs) in Ohio. The following is a recap of our accomplishments.

On September 9th, we invited Dr. Melissa Miller, associate professor in political science from BGSU, to give a presentation on Ohio's role in general elections. Using detailed data analysis,

Dr. Miller illustrated why Ohio, recognized as the most important swing state, has always picked the winning presidential candidate since 1960. Since the sentiment in Ohio most closely reflects the nation's mood, candidates spend much more effort to win over voters here than those in perennial red and blue states. A key takeaway from the presentation is that we are so lucky to be in Ohio and we should all value our votes.

On October 4th, five people from Toledo, including myself, attended the 6th AAPI Legislative Day at the Statehouse in Columbus. This annual event was organized by the Ohio Asian American Health Coalition and was open to AAPI members from across the state. The purpose was to learn about current issues, engage with speakers and attendees, and advocate to legislators. We met with the aide for the 45th district representative, which includes Toledo, to talk about the voter registration issue. In the panel discussion session, several state reps from Columbus and Cleveland areas answered questions brought up by the audience. At the end of the event, they stressed the importance of holding follow-ups by inviting state reps to formal discussions or community events, such as picnics or New Year celebration. On October 14th, we held a round table discussion on presidential candidates. People shared theirs views on both Trump and Clinton and explained why they support one over the other. Special thanks to New Empire Restaurant owner for providing delicious pineapple bread as snack.

Our get-out-the-vote events were held in the two weeks leading up to the Election Day. We had amazing participation: there were twenty-one and eighteen volunteers for two phone banking events and seven for the door-to-door. More than half were high school volunteers. CAGT provided certificates to those who needed to meet school requirements for community service hours. In the first phone banking, we called at least four hundred and seventy-nine households (a total of 1,012 voters) in NW Ohio. In the second phone bank session, we called AAPIs across Ohio. (ASIA, Inc. has yet to provide the number of people we reached out to). During the door-to-door, we knocked on ninety houses (a total of 139 people) on a nice Saturday to distribute voting information. People we met were all very friendly. They expressed appreciation for what we did.

Next year, we will continue with a series of new civic engagement activities. We hope more people, especially the younger generation, will get involved to lead, participate and give ideas. A little more effort by everyone will lead to a significant improvement to our community!

Reflection of the Year in China

I took a sabbatical leave from the University of Toledo for the academic year 2015-2016 and spent a fruitful and successful ten months with my son in Soochow University, Suzhou, China.Suzhou is a city 50 miles away from Shanghai with over 2,500 years of history. It is one of thetop tourist attractions in China, full of stone bridges and meticulously designed ancient gardens. These gardens have been added to the UNESCO World Heritage List, and according to UNESCO "they represent the development of Chinese landscape garden design over more than two thousand years," and they are the "most refined form" of garden art.

The sabbatical gave me a chance to concentrate on several papers I had been working on. The joint work with my host Dr. Lijian Yang was accepted by one of the four most prestigious journals in Statistics: Journal of the Royal Statistical Society: Series B (Statistical Methodology). I also revised several research papers with my doctoral students, and these papers have also been accepted for publication.

My son, Christopher, started his first step of the life-long-learning process in a local public elementary school in Suzhou. The school marked this important moment of the first graders by holding a grand ceremony in front of a 750-year-old temple on campus. At the beginning, it was an enormous challenge for him because his knowledge of Chinese was almost non-existent. It took him such a long time to do homework everyday that he had no time for fun at home. He had to carry a heavy backpack full of textbooks and notebooks everyday.

Although he was submerged by school work, he was happy and enjoyed playing with the 45 other classmates.

By the end of the spring semester, my son had made such impressive progress that he had almost caught up completely with his classmates and was performing at or near the top (in graded exams!) in Chinese, English and Mathematics. Our life there was full of excitement and challenges. The friendship of my collaborator, Dr. Lijian Yang, as well as that of his family and many new friends, made our life there so much easier, happier and so much more enjoyable than we had expected. We miss them very much.







Poem
